MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES AND ACTIVITIES

- Children's Ministries

 - Review and coordinate children's curricula
- Student Ministries
 - Design, develop, and implement a discipleship program for our student ministries
 - Invite and attract youth to the program
- Adult Ministries
 - Encourage and equip Sunday School Teachers
 - Oversee, equip, and support our Growth Group (Small Group) Ministries
- General
 - Develop and oversee a plan for all Discipleship Ministries
 - Shape the future of our discipleship ministries
 - Teach classes of varying sizes and ages
 - Provide leadership to appropriate teams (i.e. Learn Team, Student Ministries Team, etc.)
 - Help lead New Member and Confirmation classes

- Ability to attract, assess and equip volunteers
